**Blaze Girls Continue to Show Success in College
South Brunswick, NJ--December 12th, 2011**



A number of the New Jersey Blaze's first-year women's team have yet again proved their worth with their college teams this fall, showing their skills during the NCAA season of 2011. Following a great summer with the Blaze, it showed that competitive play during the off-season proved valuable in their college commitments.

Sarah Senoyuit, a strong young midfielder throughout the Blaze's summer campaign in New Jersey, was one of them. Playing 21 games and starting 19, Senoyuit had one goal, one assist and 14 shots in the team's amazing 19-4-0 season. This included a 7-2-0 Atlantic 10 performance and a 10-1-0 home record. The Flyers would eventually go out in the NCAA Championship first round to Louisville. However, Dayton's excellent regular-season performance would be accompanied by a 2011 National Soccer Coaches Association of America Team Academic Award, with Senoyuit forming part of the squad that tallied a 3.25 grade point average during the 2011-12 school year.

Meanwhile, Kaitlin Wylie was an integral part of the Rider Broncs (9-6-4). The defender started all 19 games for the squad for her second straight season, grabbing an assist from the back line in the process. Through the course of the season, the Broncs - members of the MAAC - outscored the opposition 37-25 and outshot them by 350-220. Wylie was also part of a solid defense that kept saves down to 78; this was 56 fewer than the 134 saves opponents were forced to make.

Finally, Meghan Ledwith - a freshman at the University of New Hampshire - had a great first season with the Wildcats. While her team were unable to make the NCAA playoffs, Ledwith nonetheless played as a forward in all 19 games, scoring three and getting two assists, as well as 23 shots. The young player has a promising three years ahead of her!
